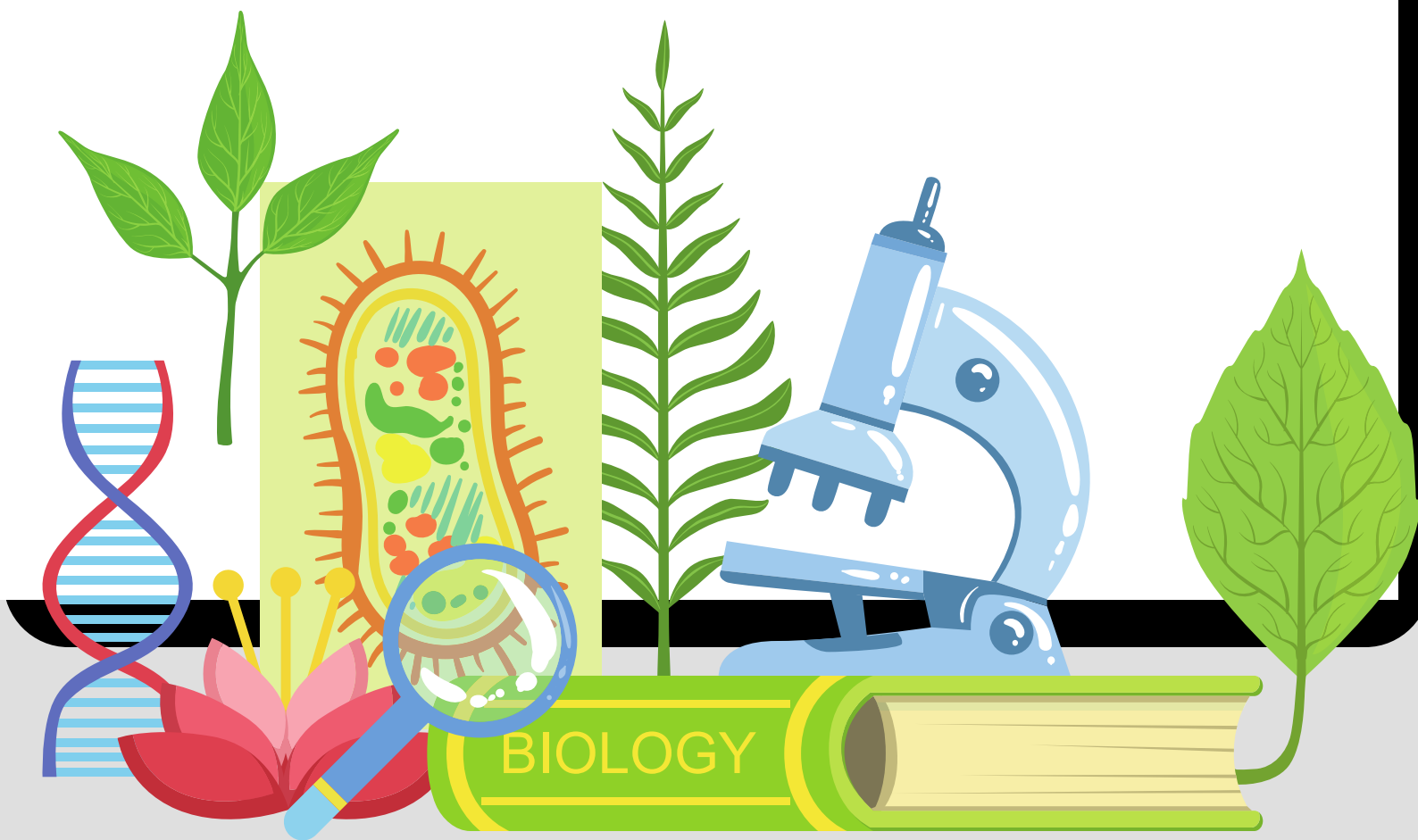
Pathways to Higher Level Math Courses

ATHLETIC ELIGIBILITY



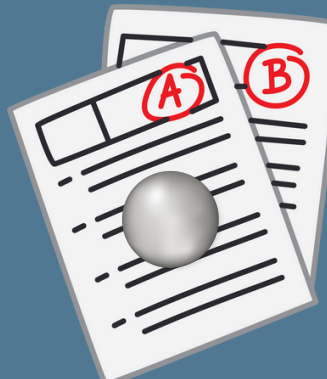
- All incoming freshman are eligible for both the Fall and Winter sports season.

- Must pass 30 credits by the end of freshman year to be eligible for the next Fall sports season.
