Curriculum and Instruction Update

Artificial Intelligence Training

Teachers have undergone training on the digital artificial intelligence platform known as Magic School AI. This program provides a variety of tools designed to help educators modify assignments, enhance project ideas, generate new tasks, and accommodate diverse student needs. The platform emphasizes privacy to protect data, ensuring that both teachers and students have a secure environment for daily classroom activities.

Training for teachers in grades 2-5 took place during our in-service on November 1st. Middle school teachers (grades 6-8) received training in half-day sessions over the past few months. Educators in grades K and 1 are scheduled to receive AI training during our upcoming in-service on March 31st. We would like to recognize the contributions of our District Technology Supervisor, Mr. Bruce Taylor, who has introduced this platform to our district. Furthermore, each school's technology specialist has developed professional development sessions for our staff. <u>Benchmark Assessments</u>

Benchmark assessments in Mathematics and English Language Arts have been administered for students in grades 3-8 across our elementary and middle schools. The data collected by our professional development coaches and content administrators will be analyzed to identify

strengths and areas for growth based on grade-level standards, allowing teachers to effectively guide their instruction.

Middle School English Language Arts Program

The English Language Arts (ELA) Department at the middle school has been diligently reviewing ELA programs to enhance our students' learning experience. In September and October, teachers conducted a thorough examination of five different program offerings. After careful consideration, the committee has narrowed the options to two promising programs. Currently, additional information is being requested from the program vendors to assist teachers and administrators in making an informed selection.

Voorhees Early Childhood Development Center Most Recent Update

Schedule:

Our previous estimated completion date was mid-February. However, we have been notified of a delay in the delivery of two main ventilation units, which are now expected to arrive in late January. The impact of this delay is still being analyzed, but it may result in a further delay in the project's completion, potentially extending the timeline to between March 15th and March 31st. We are closely monitoring the schedule and working with the contractor to identify opportunities for time savings and improve delivery times whenever possible. Interior Work:

Door frames have been installed, and drywall finishing and painting have begun on the second floor, continuing on the first floor. Bathroom wall tiling is progressing well. Floor trim installation has also started. The contractor has received inspections and is preparing to close up the walls. Work on overhead mechanical, electrical, and plumbing systems continues, and the hot water heaters have been set in place. Installation of equipment in the mechanical room and bathroom rough-ins is ongoing.

Site/Exterior Work:

Playground surfacing will proceed as soon as weather conditions allow. New window installations, roofing work, and ramp evaluation are ongoing. Underground utility installation is also in progress. Permits/Inspections:

Permits have been issued for the entire project, and inspections are up to date.

New Jersey Department of Education Definition of Chronic Absenteeism

The New Jersey Department of Education (NJDOE) defines chronic absenteeism as a student missing 10% or more of the total school days they are enrolled in a school year. Please note that all absences—except for the six NJDOE-approved reasons (see below)—are included in this calculation, regardless of documentation provided by parents or guardians.

- 1. Religious observance (N.J.A.C. 6A:32-8.3(h)); https://www.nj.gov/education/holidays20222023.shtml
- 2. A college visit (up to 3 days per school year for students in grades 11 and 12);
- 3. "Take Our Children to Work Day" or other rule issued by the Commissioner;
- 4. Participation in observance of Veterans Day (N.J.S.A. 18A: 36-13.2) or district board of election membership activities (N.J.S.A. 18A: 36-33); and

- 5. The closure of a busing district prevents a student from having transportation to the receiving school.
- 6. Participation in one "civic event" for students in grades 6-12 can only be applied to an event sponsored by a government entity, a community-based organization, or a nonprofit. The civic event is required to incorporate an element of service learning and address a public issue or concern.
