Listen and Learn Meeting with Elementary Student Council Presidents and Vice Presidents

I conducted a virtual Listen and Learn meeting with the President and Vice President of our elementary student councils on February 11, 2025, at 6:00 p.m. The purpose of this meeting was for the student leaders to share suggestions and requests on behalf of the students in their respective schools. After the meeting, I provided a written response outlining action steps related to the topics discussed. Below are some of the topics the students discussed:

- 1. Implement a Walk-A-Thon and donate the proceeds to a charity (suggested by multiple schools).
- 2. Include more writing activities in school.
- 3. Provide a dedicated classroom for the instrumental music teacher.
- 4. Organize a district-wide 5th-grade dance (suggested by multiple schools).
- 5. Create more opportunities for students across all schools to bond, such as tournaments and programs (suggested by multiple schools).
- 6. Allow students to complete their classwork during lunch.
- 7. Offer more vegetarian options on the lunch menu.
- 8. Add gluten-free options to the lunch menu.
- 9. Organize a book drive by grade level, rewarding the grade level that collects the most books with extra recess.
- 10. Offer guitar as an option for string instruments.

Curriculum and Instruction Update

Professional development coaches play a crucial role in enhancing instruction for students in grades K-5 by providing targeted support and resources to educators. These coaches work collaboratively with teachers to identify specific areas of need within their classrooms, facilitating tailored training sessions that focus on effective instructional strategies. By utilizing data-driven approaches, coaches help teachers integrate best practices into their lesson plans, ensuring that all students receive personalized learning experiences. This collaborative effort not only fosters a culture of continuous improvement but also empowers educators to refine their teaching methods, ultimately leading to improved student outcomes in literacy and mathematics.

As the March in-service approaches, teachers can look forward to an engaging agenda that includes critical updates on various educational programs and training opportunities. Educators in grades 3-5 will gain additional insight into the Wonders Reading Program, which aims to enhance literacy instruction through a comprehensive and balanced approach. Additionally, K-1 teachers will receive specialized training on incorporating artificial intelligence into their classrooms, equipping them with innovative tools to support student learning. Middle school educators will dive into analyzing iReady data to inform instruction in mathematics, while ELA teachers will explore three new programs designed to enrich their curriculum. This in-service promises to provide valuable knowledge and resources that will empower teachers and ultimately benefit their students.
